

RETIREMENT BOARD

The Retirement Plan is administered by a five member Board composed of two representatives from the City Council, a representative from the Civil Service Commission and two representatives who are city employees, one from the Police Department and one from the Fire Department, in accordance with Section 2222.1 of the San Jose Municipal Code.

As of December 31,1971, the members of the Board were as follows:

JOSEPH A. COLLA	- He is a member of the City Council and is one of its official representatives on the Board. He became a member of the Board on July 10,1967.
BARTON L. COLLINS	- First elected as a representative of the employees of the Police Department on Sept. 26, 1946. His present term expires October 10,1972.
JANET GRAY HAYES	- She is a member of the City Council and is one of its official representatives on the Board. She became a member of the Board on July 12,1971.
RAYMOND E. JONES	- First elected as a representative of the employees of the Fire Department on October 11,1962. His present term expires on November 30, 1974.
DOROTHY D. SILVA	- She is a member of the Civil Service Commission and serves on the Board at the pleasure of that body. She was appointed on April 6,1970, and

INVESTMENT REPORT 12/31/70 - 12/31/71

During the year, a net total of \$3,567,000 was added to the 1961 Police & Fire Department Retirement Plan investment portfolio to bring the Plan's investment on a cost basis to \$22,051,000. The annual rate of income from investments at year end was increased by \$228,000, raising the total yearly income to \$1,272,000. The mayority of the 1971 contributions (almost 90%) was invested in high coupon, long-term, ten-year protected, corporate bonds having an average yield of 7.04%. The remaining contributions were invested in common stocks, providing a dividend rate of return of approximately 2.50%. The annual return based on the total cost of the portfolio was 5.77%. The following figures set forth the historical record of the Fund since June 30, 1959 when Scudder, Stevens & Clark began the supervision of the assets:

1961 POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENT RETIREMENT PLAN HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PERIOD JANUARY 1, 1971 TO DECEMBER 31, 1971

- 1. Virginia C. Shaffer, representative from the City Council, retired on June 30, 1971.
- 2. Janet Gray Hayes became the new Council representative on July 12, 1971.
- 3. Dorothy D. Silva, representative from the Civil Service Commission, was appointed Chairman by the Board on July 13, 1971.
- 4. An actuarial survey was undertaken June 30, 1970, and the actuarial recommendations were accepted by the Board on May 24, 1971, and forwarded to the City Council.
- 5. Membership in the Plan was 1,067 as of December 31, 1971.
- 6. Six members retired for service and nineteen members retired because of disabilities during 1971.
- 7. There are 110 members and 19 survivors receiving benefits from the Plan as of December 31, 1971.
- 8. During the reporting period five Fire members and eighteen Police members left the membership of the Retirement Plan and had their contributions refunded.
- 9. The Retirement Fund balance as of December 31, 1971 was \$22,569,933.00.
- Payment of pensions or survivors benefits increased from about \$45,000 per month to about \$60,000 per month during the reporting period.
- 11. Interest on investments for the year was \$1,190,682 and averaged about \$99,000 per month for the year of 1971.
- 12. Short-Term investments earned \$22,375 during 1971.
- 13. A revised annual change notice was sent out in December 1971, in order to keep each member's file current.
- 14. Yield on investments averaged 7.04% for the year, which raised the annual return for the entire portfolio to 5.77% as of December 31, 1971.
