INVESTMENT REPORT 12/31/69 - 12/31/70

During the year, a net total of \$4,000,000 was added to The Police and Fire Department Retirement Plan investment portfolio to bring the Plan's investment on a cost basis to \$18,484,000. The annual rate of income from investments at year-end was increased by \$311,000, raising the total yearly income to \$1,044,000. The majority of the 1970 contributions (almost 90%) was invested in high coupon, long-term, ten-year protected, corporate bonds having an average yield of 8.07%. The remaining contributions were invested in common stocks, providing a dividend rate of return of approximately 3.44%. The annual return based on the total cost of the portfolio was 5.65%. The following figures set forth the historical record of the Fund since June 30, 1959 when Scudder, Stevens & Clark began the supervision of the assets.

CODE REVISIONS ENACTED IN 1970

- 1. Ordinance 15118 adopted on 3-16-70 adopted a new Part 6 (Cost of Living Ordinance) and also amended the Code to permit disability retirement at age 65 and require determination as to whether service or non-service.
- 2. Ordinance 15286 adopted on 7-20-70 amended S 2903.60 to change the final compensation from 36 months to 12 months aggregate service.
- 3. Ordinance 15311 adopted on 8-10-70 amended S 2903.177, 178 and .208 to increase Service and Disability allowances on or after 9-1-70 for members who retired on or after 1-1-70 with more than 20 years of service.
- 4. Ordinance 15430 adopted on 8-17-70 amended S 2903.250 and .251, .255 to change the manner in which return of contributions and interest is to be made. Provides for return of contributions to surviving minor children when there is no surviving spouse.
- 5. Ordinance 15347 adopted on 8-24-70 amended S 2904.505 to determine how the percentage of increase or decrease in the cost-of-living is made and calculated.
